

Using citrus fruits in season is a delightful way to enjoy their vibrant flavours and reap the health benefits they offer. There has been a focus on citrus dessert this term and a standout winner was the lemon coconut slice. The combination of the buttery crust, lemon filling and zesty citrus flavour creates a perfect balance of flavour. Be sure to check out the recipe yourself.

Lemon Coconut Slice

Ingredients:

Lemon Slice Base

80a butter

3/4 cup sweetened condensed milk

250g plain sweet biscuits (like Arnotts Marie biscuits)

1 cup desiccated coconut

lemon juice and zest from 1 lemon

Lemon Frosting

3 cups pure icing sugar

90g butter softened to room temperature

5 tablespoons extra lemon juice

3 tablespoons desiccated coconut



Method:

Grease and line a 18cm x 28cm rectangular slice tin with baking paper.

Crush biscuits and place crumbs into a bowl.

Add desiccated coconut and grated lemon rind. Mix to combine.

Add melted butter, condensed milk and the juice from 1 lemon to the biscuit mixture. Mix thoroughly until well combined.

Press into the prepared tin and place into the fridge.

In a bowl, whisk the icing sugar, room temperature butter and extra lemon juice in a bowl until creamy and 'frosting-like' - if the frosting is too thick to spread, add a little more lemon juice.

Spread the frosting over the slice, sprinkle with the extra coconut and place back into the fridge to firm completely.

Cut into pieces once slice has firmed.








Work Placement Learning


Do you have a part-time job?

What we are doing

- · clearing vegetation
- · earth works
- building road, asphalt, footpaths, and kerbing
- installing temporary fencing
- installing and relocating underground utilities
- installing transportable buildings and lighting
- modifying the Duncan-Kitchener intersection.

When

7am - 7pm, Monday to Saturday.

Where

 Kitchener Avenue, between Duncan and Gresham streets, Victoria Park. See diagram overleaf.

What to expect

- increased noise, vibrations and dust
- increased heavy vehicle movements
- pedestrian and cycling path detours
- restricted parking along Duncan Street, Kitchener and Axon Avenues
- controlled traffic lights at Duncan Street and Kitchener Avenue
- all works follow approved noise and traffic management plans
- every effort will be made to minimise disruption.

About the project

The Victoria Park-Canning Level Crossing Removal project is Perth's first major elevated rail designed to improve public transport safety, create new and versatile public open space for the community and reduce traffic congestion.
